HOW TO GET TO F.A. Seiberling Nature

Realm. F.A. Seiberling Nature Realm is located between Sand Run and Riverview Roads, in west Akron.

EXPLORE

From 1-77 North: Exit at Miller Rd. Go straight on Miller Rd. and follow until it dead-ends into Sand Run Pkwy. Turn right on Sand Run Pkwy. and follow until the light at Sand Run Rd. Turn left on Sand Run Rd. and go to the light at Smith Rd. Turn right on Smith Rd. and the park entrance is approx. 1/4 mi. on the right. From 1-80 Turnpike or 1-77 South: Take Exit 11 to I-77. Take I-77 South to Exit 138 Ghent Rd. Turn right (south) on Ghent Rd. and go to the light at Smith Rd. Turn left on Smith Rd. After the third light at Sand Run Rd, the park entrance is approx. 1/4 mi. on the right.


