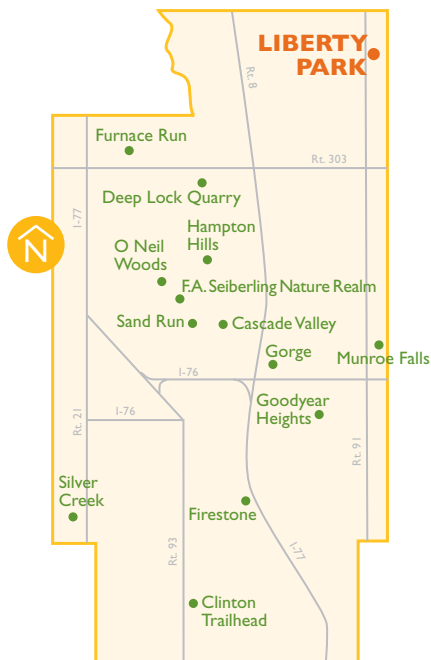




Liberty Park

HOW TO GET TO Liberty Park.

Liberty Park is located east of Darrow Road (State Rt. 91) in Twinsburg.

Recreation Area: 9385 Liberty Rd., Twinsburg

**Pond Brook Conservation Area:
3973 E. Aurora Rd., Twinsburg**

From I-480: Exit at E. Aurora Rd. For the recreation area, travel east, stay straight and go on to Cannon Rd. Turn left (north) at Liberty Rd. Park entrance is on the right. For the conservation area, stay on E. Aurora Rd. (State Rt. 82). Park entrance is on the left.

Facilities and Recreational Information

The City of Twinsburg manages the park's 100-acre recreation area, including the play fields and playground. Metro Parks manages the remaining 1,300-plus acres, including the trails and Pond Brook Conservation Area. Both areas are open 6 a.m. to sunset.

Liberty Park features two trails, four ball fields, two soccer fields, a playground, a 0.5-acre dog park and an open-air picnic shelter. The shelter is available on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information, call the City of Twinsburg's Parks & Recreation Department at 330-963-8722.

Conservation

Pond Brook Conservation Area is a designated Low Impact Area, meaning park improvements will be kept to a minimum and mowing is limited. This natural look protects the various species that live in the area's wetlands and vernal pools.

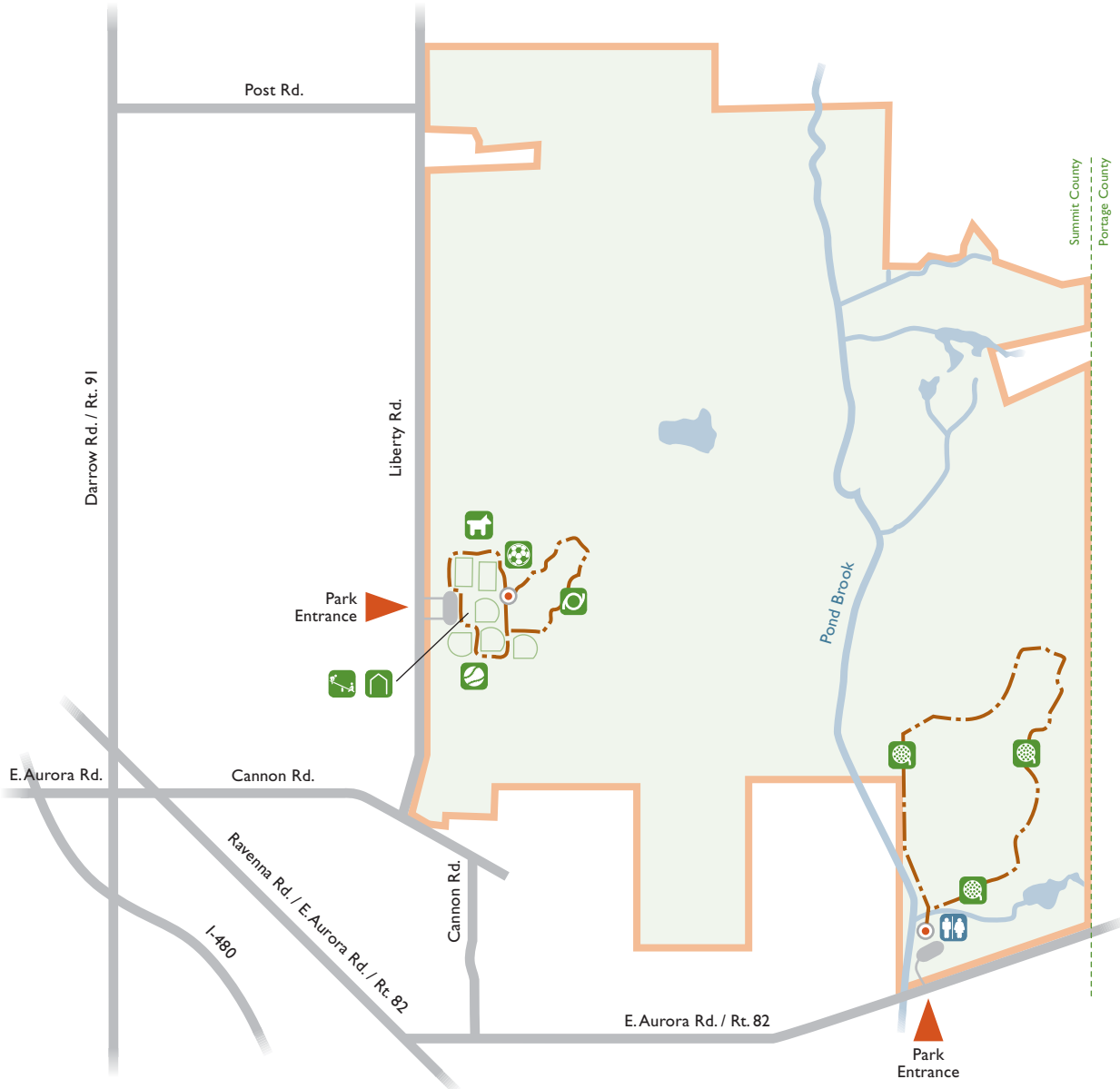

Liberty Park is a unique partnership between the City of Twinsburg and Metro Parks, Serving Summit County.

Long before the 1,435-acre park was formed, humans in prehistory camped here, sipped from the clean, cold springs and hunted game. With European settlement, trees were cleared for farming, yet maples were spared for their sweet sap; they still stand as sentinels along the Sugarbush Trail. Other large trees exist on rock ledges and in wetland areas, where ferns and bogs are "protected" by poison sumac and swamp rose. Countless rare and endangered species can be observed within the park.
