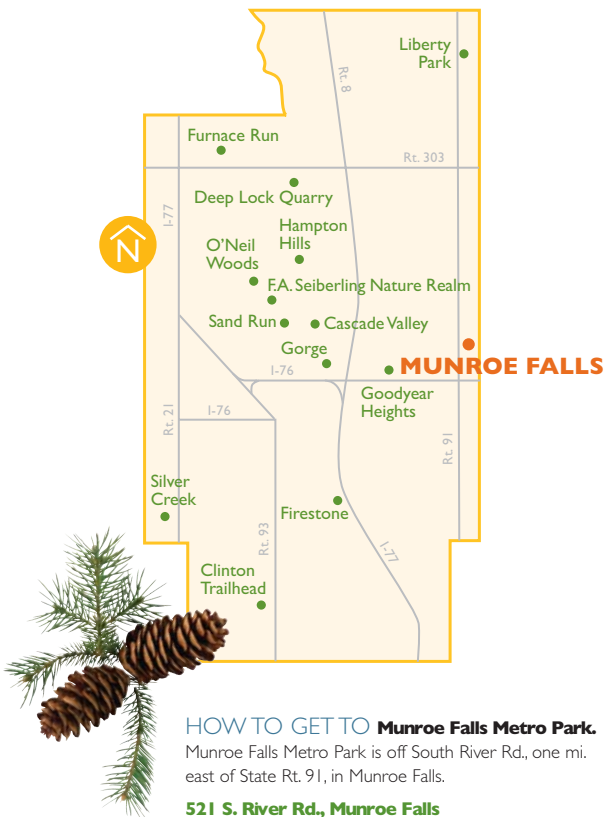




Munroe Falls Metro Park



It's a great place to enjoy the sporting life, but particularly if you like the water!

Munroe Falls Metro Park offers facilities and areas for a wide variety of sports, including a baseball field, a fishing pond, volleyball and tennis courts, a winter sledding hill and a cross-country ski trail. But, it is particularly attractive to water sports enthusiasts of all ages. The park's centerpiece is a 13-acre lake that features diving boards, large wading areas, and a soft lawn/sand beach area with picnic shelters. Pedal boats are available for rent during the swimming season, which opens Memorial Day weekend.

HOW TO GET TO Munroe Falls Metro Park.

Munroe Falls Metro Park is off South River Rd., one mi. east of State Rt. 91, in Munroe Falls.

521 S. River Rd., Munroe Falls

From State Rt. 8: If south of Cuyahoga Falls, exit at Portage Trail. Turn right (east) and go to Munroe Falls Ave. (at the first traffic light). Turn left onto Munroe Falls Ave. and travel approx. two mi. to State Rt. 91. Turn right (south) on State Rt. 91 and go to South River Rd. (approx. 1/4 mi.). Turn left on South River Rd. and go one mi. to the park entrance on the right. If north of Cuyahoga Falls, exit at Graham Rd. Turn left (east) and go to State Rt. 91 (Darrow Rd.). Turn right (south) on State Rt. 91. You will cross over the Cuyahoga River; cross some railroad tracks and go through a light at Munroe Falls Ave. After the light at Munroe Falls Ave., go approx. 1/4 mi. to South River Rd. Turn left on South River Rd. and go one mi. to the park entrance on the right.

Picnic Shelters

Main Beach Shelter accommodates up to 80 people.
Maple Beach Shelter accommodates up to 64 people.
Shady Beach Shelter accommodates up to 48 people.
All shelters are open-air and can be reserved by calling 330-867-5511.

Swimming

A swimming lake is open to the public during the summer months. The swimming season opens Memorial Day weekend. During swim season, an admission fee is charged for entry into the park. Season swim passes are available. Children under 2 years of age are admitted free.

Courts, Play Fields and Playgrounds

- Two volleyball courts
- One basketball court
- Four tennis courts
- One soccer field

Two playgrounds near the beach have age-specific equipment for children 2-5 years and 5-12 years. Courts and play fields are first-come, first-served.

Fishing

Fishing is permitted in Heron Pond only. State fishing regulations apply.

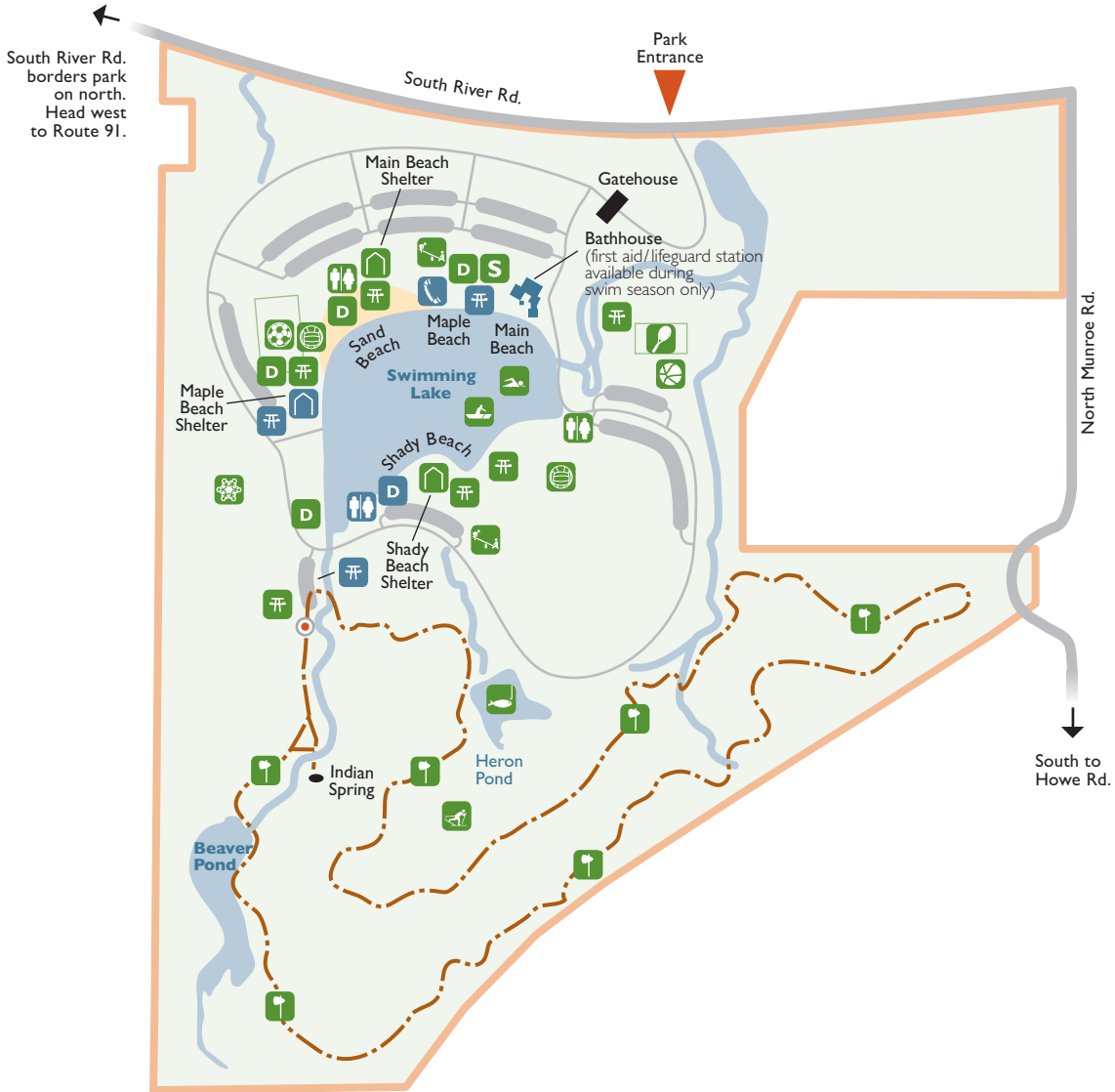
