SEE SPECTACULAR SPRING WILDFLOWERS

Large white trillium – our state wildflower – has bloomed early this year.

See this spring beauty, and more than six other species of wildflowers, **Sunday, May 4 at 2 p.m.**, starting at the Barn Lot at O'Neil Woods Metro Park, 2400 Bath Rd., Bath. Volunteer naturalist Alice Philips leads this 1.8-mile hike along Deer Run Trail.

Visitors will look for flowers growing along Yellow Creek, including Virginia bluebells, violets, foam flowers, trout lilies, Solomon's seal, rattlesnake weed and golden ragwort. "Now is the time to see the flowers, since they'll only bloom for a short time," Philips said.
