THOUSANDS OF DAFFODILS PEAK BY NEXT WEEK

Better late than never.

Thousands of yellow and white daffodils should peak by next week, **April 21 through April 27**, along the H.S. Wagner Daffodil Trail in Furnace Run Metro Park, 3100 Brush Rd., Richfield. The peak is about a week later than usual because of a slow warm-up.

"It seems the daffodils are a little late this season," said Park Manager Craig Lane. "Peak is generally the third week of April."

The 0.6-mile trail is named for the park district's first director-secretary, Harold S. Wagner, who planted the first bulbs there. Today, an estimated 30,000 to 40,000 daffodils grow along the trail.
