## **LOOK AND LISTEN FOR NATURE AT NIGHT**

Discover the interesting life of animals that stay up late.

First, listen for vocalizing amphibians and mammals while hiking the 1-mile Old Mill Trail, **Friday, April 11 at 7 p.m.**, at the Brushwood Area at Furnace Run Metro Park, 4955 Townsend Rd., Richfield. If the animals are quiet, Naturalist Dee Casteel will play owl, frog, coyote, beaver and raccoon sounds for visitors. Casteel will also show visitors animal pelts and beaver chews.

Then, look for creatures that sleep all day while hiking the 0.5-mile Cherry Lane Trail, **Friday, April 18 at 7 p.m.**, at F.A. Seiberling Nature Realm, 1828 Smith Rd., Akron. Naturalist Nicki Schneider will bring some pelts of nocturnal animals that participants may see along the hike.
