SIGNIFICANT SITES IN OHIO OFFER ONE-TANK TRIPS

Save on gas this summer while you 'unearth' some local history.

Discover many historic Indian sites around Ohio, including the Serpent Mound, Hopewell Mounds and Fort Laurens – the only Revolutionary War outpost in the state – **Sunday, April 20 at 2 p.m.**, at F.A. Seiberling Nature Realm, 1828 Smith Rd., Akron.

Noted photographer Denny Reiser will also highlight where the Mingo, Shawnee, Delaware and Wyandotte tribes once thrived. "People always think that to see historic sites they need to travel outside Ohio," said Reiser. "I'll teach visitors how they can find these places in their own back yards."

Reiser, a retired teacher and interpretive ranger for Cuyahoga Valley National Park, has traveled around the state to gather information on the first inhabitants of Ohio and their preserved sites.
