Welcome to the Regional Water Trail Master Plan information site.

Imagine canoeing or kayaking from the Portage Lakes to downtown Akron for a baseball game, to watch the fireworks or to visit your favorite festival or restaurant. Or paddle to downtown Barberton for an afternoon at Lake Anna for the Mum Festival. Water trails create opportunities for tourism and economic development, nurture advocates for water quality improvements, and attract young professionals to the region.

According to the ODNR Division of Watercraft the sales of human powered boats (kayaks and canoes) have increased by 50% over the last five years while motorized boat sales have remained relatively level.

The outcome of the study will be a comprehensive reference for potential public and private investments that can be made to complete the proposed water trail system in southern Summit County. The plan will be used as a tool to secure funding for these improvements and a guide to future development. This plan can also be used to apply for State designation through the ODNR as an "Ohio Water Trail" and qualify for ODNR funds to develop a water trail map for use as a long term marketing and development tool.

Below is a summary of the comments/questions that brought up during the first advisory meeting:

- 1) Water Trail wayfinding via buoy system or similar. Consider potential speed zone conflicts for Water Trail. The City of Akron wants to revitalize the cut off neighborhood east of Summit Lake and south of I-76/77
- 2) East Reservoir is being looked at by a consulting firm to come up with a viable option to have the structure comply with current dam safety regulations.
- 3) Motorboats are allowed on O&E Canal (6MPH or less/no wake) currently. Should there be a horsepower and boat size limit except for permitted excursion service?
- 4) Reconstructing the guard lock on the north end of Long Lake would have no implications across watersheds. It could have automatic gates with warning system to detect gate jams. Or a mechanical device could be used to make the connection.
- 5) Using the Tuscarawas River Raceway is better than Nimisila Reservoir because the River's watershed is larger and could recharge the portage lakes' system very quickly (days) as compared to the Reservoir which could take years.
- 6) The County removed a number of bridges over the Raceway and other water channels and replaced them with culverts. Should some or all of these crossing be converted back to bridges?


