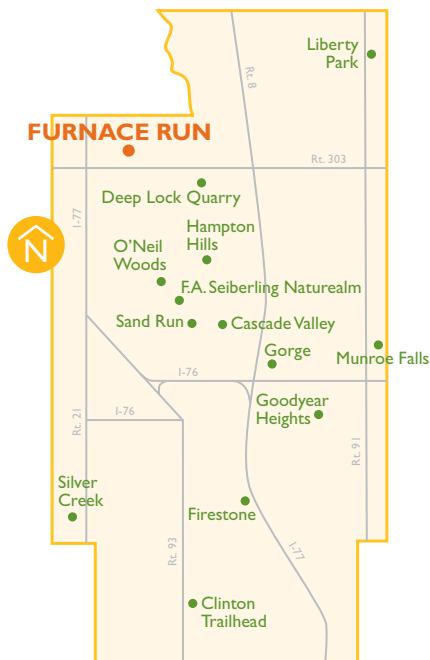




Furnace Run Metro Park



Furnace Run is a great place to visit anytime of the year, but don't miss it in the spring! The H.S.

Wagner Daffodil Trail bears the name of the Metro Parks' first director and the person from whom the property was originally purchased. In early spring, the trail blazes in color as thousands of daffodils planted on the property burst into magnificent bloom.

HOW TO GET TO Furnace Run Metro Park.

Furnace Run Metro Park is located off Townsend Rd., one mile northwest of Brecksville Rd., in the Richfield Brushwood Area.

4955 Townsend Rd., Richfield

From I-77: Take exit #143 at Wheatley Rd. (State Route 176/Richfield). Go west on Wheatley Rd. 1/2 mile to Brecksville Rd. Go north on Brecksville Rd. approximately 2 1/2 miles to Townsend Rd. Turn left on Townsend Rd. and travel one mile to the park entrance on the right.



Pavilion

Brushwood Pavilion is an enclosed, heated facility which accommodates up to 100 people and can be reserved by calling 330-867-5511.
