

HOW TO GET TO Cascade Valley Metro Park

North. Cascade Valley Metro Park North is located off Cuyahoga St., between Uhler Ave. and VV. Portage Trail, in North Akron.

From State Rt. 8: Exit at Tallmadge Ave. Go west on Tallmadge Ave. approx. one mi. to Cuyahoga St. Go north (right) on Cuyahoga St. one mi. to the Schumacher Valley Area entrance on the left.

Overlooking the Cuyahoga River, the Schumacher Valley Area of Cascade Valley Metro Park contains some of the most rugged and "wildest" terrain within the City of Akron and some of the most pristine scenery in Summit County. Facilities in this area include a 1.2-mile hiking trail and parking lot. Because the area has long survived the pressure of expanding urban development, park facilities will remain limited to ensure that it continues to be preserved in its natural state.


