As Summit Metro Parks celebrates the conclusion of its 60th Fall Hiking Spree, the park district proudly recognizes the remarkable achievements of four extraordinary individuals known as the "Original Hikers." Ranging from age 73 to 103, Original Hikers Joan Haby, Jennifer Hoffman, Jennie Pier and Neva Ucker have hiked the Fall Hiking Spree since its inaugural year in 1964.

Each fall, these passionate trailblazers have exemplified unwavering commitment by completing every spree without fail – a testament to their enduring love for nature and an unbreakable bond with the park district's cherished tradition. The Original Hikers have shared their spree traditions with family and friends, and many of their loved ones join them in completing the Fall Hiking Spree each year.

First-year spree hikers earn a hiking staff and shield, while returning hikers earn the shield to add to their staffs. The Original Hikers' staffs are so covered in shields, they are frequently stopped on their hikes by other visitors who admire them and wonder how long they've been hiking the spree.
