Prepare natural resource mapping products using Geographic Positioning System (GIS) and Global Positioning System (GPS) technology. Assist with all natural and cultural resource management, including resource inventory and restoration activities within the parks. In partnership with Planning & Development department will write grants for new land acquisitions and ecological restoration projects.
